COMMITTEE REPORT

The committee meeting of 9th April focussed on the Strategic Plan for our organisation. The plan will be made available for members' comments in the coming months. Plans for Christmas in July were also discussed – watch out for more information!

There are a number of members from 2023 who have not rejoined for 2024. We will be following these members up to try to encourage them to re-enrol and to improve our organisation by getting feedback on why these members have not re-enrolled. If you know of anyone who has not re-enrolled perhaps you could chat to them to encourage them to re-enrol.

UMAS STATISTICS

Our new UMAS Coordinator, Lars Jonasson, has analysed enrolments for 2024. They make for interesting reading.

- there are 47 enrolments on waitlists, but all these members (except 1) have enrolled in at least one activity and the total number of available spots in all activities is 379
- we have 68 activities
- 18% of activities are one-off
- 12 members have enrolled in over 10 activities including one-off activities (someone has enrolled in 22 activities)
- 95 members are in only one activity.

Last year, we had to close off new members as there were insufficient vacancies in activities. Should this happen again there is a question around whether or not we should limit the number of activities a member can enrol in and how we do this – an honour system?

COTTAGE SUPPLIES


